Pre-AP Objectives:

- Provide all students with materials that are on grade level with the appropriate rigor
- Create vertical continuity by continuing the Pre-AP program students experience at the 9th grade level
- Use a common framework across disciplines creating collaboration opportunities
- Pre-AP aligns with District Strategic Plan Goals 1 and 4



Pre-AP World History and Geography

The course covers basic geography skills and ancient civilizations from around the world through the Age of Exploration. Specific skills developed in this course include analysis of evidence, disciplinary reasoning, and developing arguments. Additionally, students will evaluate evidence, explain historical and geographic relationships, and incorporate evidence to support their positions.



Pre-AP English I

The course develops students' abilities to work through complex readings. They learn how close attention to parts of a text can unlock greater understanding of the whole piece. In addition, students work to build analytical writing and language skills so they can express themselves with increasing sophistication.



Pre-AP Biology

Pre-AP Biology sparks student motivation and critical thinking about our living world as they engage in real-world data analysis and problem solving. This course fosters student growth as they make meaningful connections among the structures, processes, and interactions that exist within and across living systems—from cells to ecological communities.



Pre-AP Algebra I

The course will focus on linear function and linear equations, a focus on authentic applications, and a concentration on creating mathematical arguments. Students will: work with their peers to build math knowledge, persevere through challenges and make important conceptual connections.



Pre-AP Geometry with Stats

The course has a central focus on measurement that provides students with a holistic and comprehensive view of Geometry as the study of shape and space. This course includes a unit that provides time for a sustained and focused examination of topics that are essential for quantitative literacy.



Reading

Reading I is a year-long course designed for freshman students to enhance their literacy skills and improve their ability to learn from and synthesize complex, thought-provoking informational texts. Students will be placed in either Strategic Reading, College Prep Reading, or Honors Reading using NWEA MAP and PSAT data. Students whose scores exempt them from Reading may take a variety of electives.



Physical Education & Health

BOTH are required classes in 9th grade. Students will take Freshman PE one semester and Health Education the other. Both classes are graduation requirements and will count as TWO of the EIGHT required classes from the Physical Education, Health and Driver Education Department.

Students may take Band or NJROTC as a PE credit.

What is "On Track to Graduation?" HOME OF THE TOMCATS

- → You need 22 credits to graduate: 44 courses each semester course is .5 credits.
- → You need a specific amount of credits per subject area and electives.
- → Each course has its own requirements.
- → Placement in reading courses are based on scores from MAP reading tests.
- → In order to be considered a sophomore, you must earn 5.5 credits during your freshman year.
- → All students are mandated to take state mandated testing (SAT) in order to be eligible to graduate.

An early sign of success is passing all of your courses this year and becoming a Sophomore right away! It's easier to get ahead than try to catch up later.
