## 8<sup>th</sup> grade courses that count for EAHS credit

- Algebra 1
  - Students that passed Algebra 1 in middle school will carry over 1 credit to EAHS and will be placed Pre AP Geometry with Statistics in their 9<sup>th</sup> grade year
- Spanish II
  - Students earn 1 credit for EAHS. Students can start in Spanish III Honors
- Mandarin
  - Students earn 1 credits for EAHS. Students can opt to take Mandarin II

- Pre AP Algebra I OR Pre AP Geometry with Statistics

- Freshman PE/Health
- NJROTC
- Appropriate Band placement

All students will take 7 classes each semester
