


WHAT IS THE SEAL OF BILITERACY? The Illinois State Seal of Biliteracy is an award bestowed by the Illinois State Board of Education and given by District 131 in recognition of students who have attained a high level of proficiency in one or more language in addition to English by high school graduation. The state of Illinois officially adopted the Seal of Biliteracy in 2013; District 131 first participated in the program in 2016. The Seal is affixed to the student's diploma.






WHO CAN EARN A SEAL OF BILITERACY?

Any student is eligible to earn the Seal if he/she can demonstrate proficiency in two or more languages. The languages the District can test include Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Latin, Portuguese, Russian, and Spanish.
