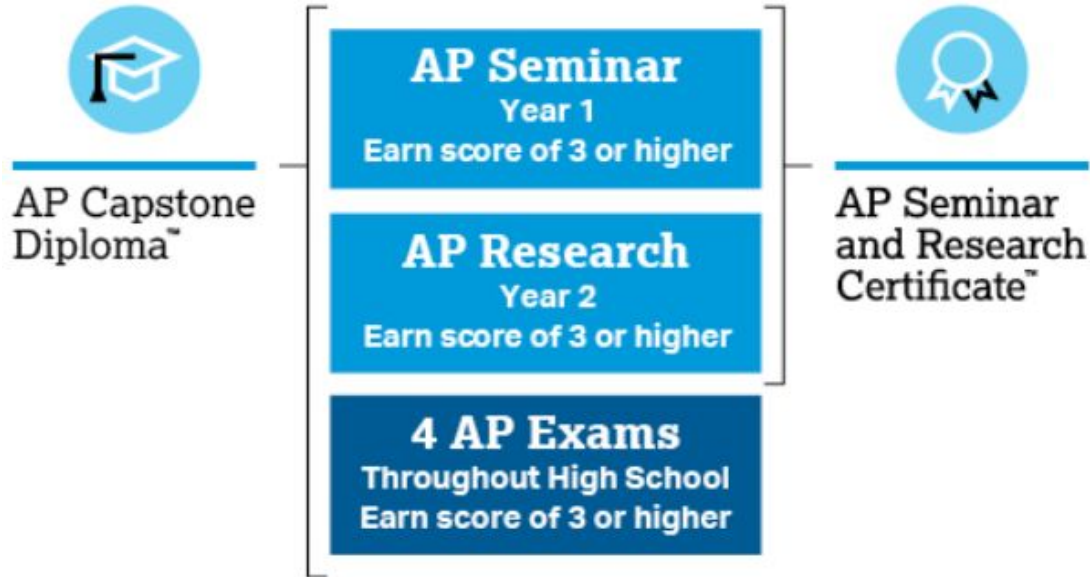
Reading Courses
